The Educational Administration Department at Oswego State will offer its Certificate of Advanced Studies (CAS) in the North Country. The CAS program includes 24 hours of coursework selected under advisement from the courses listed at the left and a 9-hour internship. The program leads to full certification in school administration.

**About the Program**

Our program in the North Country area is a collaborative effort between the educational administration professors and area schools:

Area administrators serve as guest speakers, co-teachers, or instructors in nearly all courses.

- The department works with school districts to help identify high quality internships.
- The department maintains a strong placement program, serving as a liaison between graduates pursuing employment and districts desiring to hire new administrators.
- Teams of students work on “authentic” learning assignments in and for area schools.
- The department promotes strong communication networking between students and practicing area administrators.
