Electives 21 s.h.

To be selected under advisement from a departmentally approved list of courses from cooperating departments (Anthropology, Chemistry, Counseling & Psychological Services, Political Science, Psychology, Public Justice, Sociology). Courses are to be selected to suit the student's interests and career orientation in specific areas of Public Justice. At least 15 semester hours of major electives must be taken at the 300 level or above.

Declaration of Major: Students who wish to declare a major in Public Justice must interview in advance with the Public Justice Department Advisement Coordinator. Minimum requirement is a GPA of 2.0 at the time of application. Check with the PBJ Department office for details.

Practicum [Internship]: Access to PBJ 397 is by departmental approval only. Applications for admission to PBJ 397 are available in the department office and must be received by the published deadline. Applications require an unofficial transcript or CAPP report be attached to them. **PBJ 397 application deadlines are Summer - March 1; Fall - April 1; and Spring - October 1.**

Sequential Course Policy: All Public Justice core courses must be taken in sequence. The prerequisite for all core courses is a grade of C- or better in all previous core courses. **NO TWO PUBLIC JUSTICE CORE COURSES MAY BE TAKEN TOGETHER.** *[Students who are in their last semester at Oswego, may complete PBJ 397 and PBJ 401 simultaneously.]*
