

# Embed a Slide Show on Your Web Page

## *Using Picasa*

You must have a private Google account in order to create a slide show to embed on a web page. LakerApps has not released this feature.

1. Go to <http://picasaweb.google.com> and log in
2. Click on the photo album you would like to make into a slide show and embed on a web page

Or, create a new album

1. Click on Upload
2. Name the album
3. Select photos from your computer
4. Upload them to the album on Picasa

Photos must be made public.

1. Click on the album
2. Choose Actions > Album Properties
3. On the bottom, choose 'Public on the Web'

Embedding the slide show on a web page:

You can embed a Flash slide show of any web album. It will be automatically updated when you make changes to your album. Follow these steps to embed a slide show:

- On the MyPhotos tab, click your album to select it.
- Click on 'Link to this album.' (on the right)
- Click 'Embed Slideshow.'
- Choose your slide show settings, such as size, captions, and autoplay.  
Size:
  - Choose Large 400 px for the main body copy;
  - Small 144 px for placement on a right column.
- Once you've chosen your settings, copy the resulting HTML code (Ctrl+C).
- Paste the copied code into the HTML in the source code on your web page or component (Ctrl+V).

If you choose to copy and paste a link to the slide show, viewers will be taken directly to your album on Picasa.
