

Glassy Buttons the Easy Way ...

The website at <http://www.glassybuttons.com/glassy.php> gives you an easy way to create buttons for your web pages. Just fill in the blanks and click 'download zipped images.'

Notes:

- Items with a star ★ were edited to create the button seen in this screen snapshot.
- After you make a change, click the 'Reload' button to see the effect.
- Button text: If entering multiple lines of text, be sure to make the button width and height large enough.
- Colors: Choose the color using the web-style hexadecimal format for specifying the red, green and blue components. For example, a pure white color is **FFFFFF**. Do not use the # character. Or, use the color selector .
- Questions? - click on the Question mark.
- When the button looks the way you want, click on download zipped images.
- We highly recommend you **make a note of the settings you use**, just in case you need to replace or create a new button.

Insert the buttons in Ingeniux

1. Unzip the file you downloaded from the Glassy Button site.
2. In Ingeniux, upload the jpg images. They will be named button_0.jpg and button_1.jpg.
(If your button is set with a clear background use the .png files instead.)
3. Check the page out.
4. Click in the spot where the image is to be placed.
5. Click Insert/Edit Image.
6. Browse to the images you just uploaded and choose button_0.jpg. Click OK.
7. Enter an image description.
8. Click on the Advanced tab.
9. Under Swap Image, click the check box next to Alternative image.
10. For mouse over — Browse and choose button_1.jpg. Click OK.
11. For mouse out — Browse and choose button_0.jpg. Click OK.
12. Click on insert.
13. Page view or Preview. Your image should change colors on mouse over.
