Interested in learning more about Terrorism and Homeland Security?

Public Justice is offering a new class over the summer called Terrorism and Homeland Security (PBJ 383), taught by Professor Jones. This course will introduce public justice and social science students to the study of terrorism.

This course will cover definitions and motivation for terrorism; religious, ideological, nationalistic, and ethnic terrorism; domestic and international terrorist movements; technological, cyber, nuclear, biological, and chemical terrorism; terrorist financing; Jihadist networks; and the organization and functions of Homeland Security; the protection of constitutional rights and civil liberties; and the effect of the media on terrorism.

Fall '06 Registration
