• Serve on a committee

SUNY Oswego has 4 relevant committees which foster international education on campus. Consider joining one or more and contribute your talents and experience:

• Propose a Course with International Travel

More than 25 Oswego faculty members are teaching courses this year that include short-term international travel. Faculty-led programs are the fastest growing type of education abroad experience, and Oswego has a robust offering making us the #2 campus in SUNY for overall study abroad enrollments. Our faculty lead students to all continents except Antarctica (yet) and come from all 4 colleges and schools. Science courses to Brazil, education courses to Benin and India, business courses to China, and art, communication, and social science courses to Europe and elsewhere give our students incredible access to the world. Consider proposing a course with travel abroad.

• Faculty International Travel Grants, and Campus Internationalization Grants

The Office of International Education and Programs provides (budget permitting) limited grant funding to faculty members wishing to travel outside the United States to conduct research, to present at conferences, and to develop new courses and programs. In addition, faculty and departments seeking funding to bring internationally-themed speakers, performers, and programs to campus for the benefit of the SUNY Oswego community can apply to OIEP for limited financial support.

• Teach Abroad

OIEP can arrange for faculty members to teach during the summer in our London center, other select locations, and can assist in designing new summer programs overseas. Faculty members on sabbatical can teach in residence at one of our partner universities abroad, and we can advise you on applying for a Fulbright award.
