The determination for these awards is made from the SUNY Common Application and Oswego Admissions supplements submitted for admission to Oswego.

No additional application is necessary. Freshman and transfer students should complete the application for admission as early as possible, or before April 1 to be considered for these awards. Unless otherwise noted, the Office of Admissions will select the successful candidate.

Andrew C. Burnett '92 Scholarship¹ (ACNT 321)

Amount: \$500 **Recipient:** One
This award was created by Andrew C. Burnett '92 to provide scholarship support for students attending Oswego State from Webster, NY. This award is intended to encourage and assist a graduating high school senior from Webster, NY, to pursue his/her education at Oswego State. Preference will be given to those interested in attending the School of Business and/or who are athletes.

Bakhom Ghoibrial and L. Zahia Sorial Ghoibrial Presidential Scholarship¹ (ACNT 505)

Amount: \$5,000 each **Recipient(s):** Four
Dr. Girgis B. Ghoibrial (d.2001), professor emeritus from the geography department, bequeathed the college a significant sum of monies to establish a scholarship fund to honor his parents, Bakhom Ghoibrial (d.1945) and L. Zahia Sorial Ghoibrial (d.1992). These Presidential Scholarships will forever memorialize Dr. Ghoibrial's parents' kindness and their deep regard for higher education. These scholarships will be awarded to incoming freshmen who meet the qualifications for presidential scholarships. The scholarships can be renewed up to four years.

The Barbara Shineman '65 Scholarship¹ (ACNT 400)

Amount: \$1,200 **Recipient:** One
Dr. Barbara Palmer Shineman, an alumna of the Albion Central School District, a 1965 alumna and a former professor at SUNY Oswego, established a scholarship for a student enrolled at SUNY Oswego's School of Education. Preference will be given to a graduate from Charles D'Amico High School. Second preference will be given to students from other schools in Orleans County. Third preference will be given to students from Western New York State. Recipients must meet SUNY Oswego's criteria for merit scholarships.

Barry Taylor Memorial Fund¹ (ACNT 374)

Amount: \$650 **Recipient:** One
This fund was created by John and Dorothy Woodland Taylor '59, family members and friends in memory of Barry Taylor (d.1993) to keep his spirit alive and commemorate his commitment to community leadership. This award is intended to encourage and assist a graduating high school senior from Mexico High School to pursue his/her education at Oswego State. Preference will be given to a student with special interests in the cultural arts including music, art, and/or theatre. Demonstrated community leadership will strengthen one's candidacy.

Clara Hill Murphy '27 Scholarship¹ (ACNT 662)

Amount: \$1,800 **Recipient:** One
The award will be presented to an outstanding entering freshman. Criteria includes high school average, standardized test scores and leadership. Special consideration will be given to graduates of Solvay High School.

Elsie Hutchinson Morris Scholarship¹ (ACNT 621)

(Named in honor of the four Hutchinson Sisters '12,'13,'15 & '17)
Amount: \$4,000 each **Recipient(s):** Two
Elsie Hutchinson Morris bequeathed the college a significant sum to establish a scholarship fund. Two recipients, one male and one female, will be selected from applicants (entering freshmen or transfer students) who have graduated from an Oswego County high school. Candidates must have a demonstrated need for financial aid.

Eugenio Maria de Hostos Scholarship¹ (ACNT 125)

Amount: \$200 **Recipient:** One
This scholarship was established by Latino faculty and staff for a first-year Latino student. The scholarship is for an entering Latino freshman with the highest incoming academic record. Applicant must be a student who has been accepted and will be attending Oswego State. The award will go to the incoming student with the highest combined ACT/SAT score and high school GPA.

Frances Mattison Hoenow '37 & Otto Hoenow Scholarship¹

Amount: \$2,500 each **Recipient(s):** Four
This scholarship was established by Mr. and Mrs. Otto Hoenow to be used as a recruitment mechanism for attracting deserving Oswego County students to Oswego State. This scholarship is available to graduating high school seniors. The individuals must be Oswego County residents, preferably from the Altmar/Sandy Creek area. Candidate's need for financial assistance is paramount in receiving the award. (#504 INTERNAL USE)

Freshman Chemistry Scholarship¹ (ACNT 124)

Amount: \$500 each **Recipient(s):** Four
The Freshman Chemistry Scholarship was established anonymously to encourage academically outstanding high school students to attend Oswego State and major in chemistry. To qualify and receive the Freshman Chemistry Scholarship, a student must be accepted as a matriculated freshman chemistry major with a strong high school background, especially in the areas of chemistry, mathematics and other sciences.

George M. Penney Presidential Scholarship (ACNT 361)

Amount: \$3,500 **Recipient:** One
The late George Penney, a former College Council member, and his wife, Mary, bequeathed a generous sum to Oswego State to establish an endowed scholarship. Judge Penney's commitment to higher education and Oswego State will be forever memorialized by a Presidential Scholarship, which will be offered to an incoming freshman majoring in Public Justice or enrolled in the School of Business.

Gerald J. Friends '55 Scholarship for the Schodack Central School District

Amount: \$1,000 **Recipient:** One
This scholarship was established by Gerald J. Friends '55 as an incentive for an incoming freshman or transfer student from the Schodack Central School District (Maple Hill High School) or any successor district to attend the State University of New York at Oswego. To qualify for this award, a student must:
a. Be an incoming freshman or transfer student from the Schodack Central School District (Maple Hill High School)
b. Preference will be given to students interested in English, Writing, Math or Science.

Gerhard D. Zeller New Student Scholarship¹ (ACNT 405)

Amount: \$700 **Recipient:** One
This scholarship was established in memory of Gerhard D. Zeller to honor his commitment to the Native American community. Qualified applicants will be of Native American descent. New and transfer students are eligible to receive this scholarship.

Girgis B. Ghoibrial Presidential Scholarship (ACNT 505)

Amount: \$4,400 **Recipient(s):** Ten
The late Dr. Girgis B. Ghoibrial (d.2001) bequeathed a generous sum to Oswego State to establish an endowed Presidential Scholarship. Dr. Ghoibrial, the founder and former chair of Oswego State's Geography Department, has provided Oswego State students with scholarships for the past several years. The establishment of the Girgis B. Ghoibrial Presidential Scholarship will forever be a tribute to Dr. Ghoibrial's commitment to higher education and his love for Oswego State. These awards will be presented to incoming freshmen who meet the criteria for presidential scholarships and can be renewed up to four years.

Gloria A.S. Olson '51 Scholarship¹ (ACNT 197)

Amount: \$2,000 **Recipient:** One
This scholarship, established by Gloria A.S. (Sandy) Olson '51, will be given to an incoming freshman who has shown outstanding support and commitment to his/her education. It is paramount that the recipient has demonstrated need for financial aid.

Gurden Jones '27 Presidential Scholarship¹ (ACNT 368)

Amount: \$4,300 **Recipient:** One
The Gurden Jones '27 Presidential Scholarship was established by the estate of his widow, Helen A. Jones (d.1999), to extend his lifelong commitment to education. Gurden Jones (d.1990) spent nearly 50 years teaching industrial arts in New York and New Jersey. When he retired in 1975, he moved to Florida where he launched an extensive adult education program in Port Charlotte. The Gurden Jones '27 Presidential Scholarship will make a college education possible for a highly qualified student and will serve as a lasting legacy to the memory of Mr. Jones.

Helen B. Daly Mathematics Award¹ (ACNT 506)

Amount: \$1,250 each **Recipient(s):** Two
This award was established by Dr. John Daly in memory of his wife Dr. Helen Daly (d.1995), a dedicated educator and researcher, to recruit and recognize students majoring in mathematics. Two dean level scholarships will be awarded to incoming freshmen who meet the qualifications for presidential & merit scholarships. The scholarships can be renewed up to four years.

Louella & Harold Oakley Scholarship¹ (ACNT 410)

Amount: \$500 **Recipient:** One
This scholarship was established by Naomi Oakley McCracken '70 and Douglas McCracken in memory of her parents to support and encourage an undergraduate student pursuing a degree in Computer Science, Mathematics, Chemistry, Physics or Biology. The student must have a declared major in either Computer Science, Mathematics, Chemistry, Physics or Biology. This student must demonstrate academic commitment and good citizenship. This scholarship will be awarded to an incoming full-time freshman or transfer student who meets the qualifications for a Merit Scholarship.

Lynn & Ellen Hemink Scholarship¹ (ACNT 607)

Amount: \$1,500 **Recipient:** One
This scholarship was established by Dr. and Mrs. Hemink to be used as a recruitment mechanism for attracting academically qualified students to Oswego State. Demonstrated academic excellence, leadership abilities and extracurricular activities comprise the major criteria in the selection process for this award. This scholarship is available to graduating high school seniors (minimum 85 academic average) and/or transfer students (minimum 3.0 academic average) with no specific major required. Recipient must be a New York state resident.

Myrtle Waters Stewart Scholarship¹ (ACNT 626)

Amount: \$900 **Recipient:** One
This scholarship was established by Janice Brinson '54 in memory of her mother, who passed away in 1992. It exists to assist an African-American female entering (freshman or transfer) Oswego State. Preference will be given to an education major. Demonstrated academic excellence and financial need comprise the major criteria in the selection process for this award. Original application packet should include high school guidance or departmental letter of recommendation.

Olive B. Spargo Scholarship Fund¹ (ACNT 364)

Amount: \$500 **Recipient:** One
This scholarship has been established by Olive B. Spargo '31 (d.2004) in recognition and appreciation of Oswego State and its dedicated and caring faculty. This will be awarded to a student transferring from Mohawk Valley Community College, Utica, NY, to Oswego State.

Peterson Education Scholarship¹ (ACNT 396)

Amount: \$600 each **Recipient(s):** Two
This scholarship has been established by Elsie A. Peterson '66 to assist incoming freshmen who are faced with financial needs in pursuing their degree. Two scholarships will be awarded each year. One student must be a graduate of the J.C. Birdlebough High School; Phoenix, NY, and one student must be a graduate of C.W. Baker High School; Baldwinsville, NY. Recipients must be incoming full-time freshman in the School of Education and demonstrate financial need.

Presidential & Merit Scholarships¹

Recipient(s): TBA

Oswego's Presidential Scholarship program makes available over \$2,000,000 in merit-based aid to students entering in the fall term. Awards include: \$17,600 Presidential Scholarships (\$4,400 a year for up to four years); \$5,000 Dean Scholarships (\$1,250 a year for up to four years); \$2,000 Merit Awards (\$500 a year for up to four years); Residential Scholarships (\$5,490 a year for up to four years for students from outside New York State only).

If you are applying as a full-time freshman student and are in the top 10% to 15% of your class, you will be considered for a Presidential Scholarship. Other freshmen, and two-year transfer applicants with a GPA of 3.3 and better, are eligible for Merit Award consideration. Freshman applicants residing outside New York will be considered for a Residential Scholarship.

Renee Valles Toothman '85 and Michael L. Toothman Scholarship¹ (ACNT 372)

Amount: \$500 Recipient: One

This scholarship was established by Renee Valles Toothman '85 and Michael L. Toothman to support and encourage an undergraduate student pursuing a degree in Mathematics, Chemistry or Biology. This scholarship can be renewed up to four years. To qualify a student must:

- Initially be an incoming full-time freshman or transfer student.
- Be enrolled in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, majoring in Mathematics, Chemistry or Biology
- Demonstrate academic commitment and good citizenship
- Demonstrate financial need.

Roberta Byer '71 Scholarship¹ (ACNT 611)

Amount: \$1,000 Recipient: One

This scholarship was established by the estate of Hannah Byer as stipulated in her Last Will and Testament in memory of her daughter Roberta (d.1971). The estate directed the State University of New York at Oswego to put the monies where needed. The scholarship will be available for an entering freshman or a transfer student.

Roland and Dorothy Brown Clark '36 Merit Scholarship¹ (ACNT 362)

Amount: \$1,250 Recipient: One

The late Dorothy Brown Clark '36 (d.1998), visionary past president of the Oswego Alumni Association, and her husband Roland (d.2000) bequeathed a generous sum to Oswego State to establish an endowed scholarship. To commemorate the Clarks' lifelong commitment to academic achievement and leadership, Oswego State will offer a Merit Scholarship to an incoming freshman or transfer student.

Rosean C. '31 and Russell Gay Presidential Scholarship (ACNT 391)

Amount: \$800 Recipient: One

The late Rosean C. Gay, a 1931 alumna of SUNY Oswego, and her husband, Russell, bequeathed a generous sum to Oswego State to establish an endowed scholarship. Ms. Gay's commitment to higher education and Oswego State will be forever memorialized by a Presidential Scholarship. This scholarship will be awarded to an incoming freshman who meets the qualifications for a Presidential Scholarship.

Rosemary '81 and Douglas Crane '80 Scholarship¹ (ACNT 394)

Amount: \$1,500 Recipient: One

This scholarship, established by Rose '81 and Douglas Crane '80, will be given to an incoming freshman enrolled in the School of Business. This student must demonstrate the potential for academic success and the need for financial aid.

Sharon '74 and Joseph Yacura '74 Endowed Scholarship¹ (ACNT 358)

Amount: \$1,950 Recipient: One

This scholarship was established by Sharon '74 and Joseph Yacura '74 to be given to an incoming freshman entering the School of Business who has demonstrated financial need, by qualifying for financial aid. Preference for this award will be given to students from the counties of Broome, Chemung and Schuyler, NY.

Sharon '74 and Joseph Yacura '74 Endowed Scholarship for the School of Communication, Media, and the Arts

Amount: \$1,000 Recipient: One

Sharon '74 and Joseph Yacura '74 established this scholarship to provide financial assistance to a deserving freshman entering the newly established School of Communication, Media and the Arts starting in the fall of 2008. The scholarship recipient will continue to receive this award annually, for a maximum of four years, as long as they maintain a minimum of a 3.0 GPA. At the end of four years (or sooner depending on the recipient's GPA) a new scholarship recipient will be selected who meets the scholarship criteria listed below. To qualify for this award, a student must be:

- An incoming freshman entering the School of Communication, Media and the Arts and majoring in Broadcasting and Mass Communication.
- Demonstrate financial need by qualifying for financial aid.
- Preference for this award will be given to students from the counties of Broome (preferred), Chemung and Schuyler, NY.

The Stephen and Ann Coco Presidential Scholarship Fund (ACNT 365)

Amount: \$1,850 each Recipient(s): Three

The late Stephen Coco '66 and his wife Ann, bequeathed a generous sum to Oswego State to establish an endowed scholarship. The Coco's commitment to higher education and Oswego State will be forever memorialized by these presidential scholarships, which will be offered to incoming freshmen pursuing teaching degrees in the departments of Technology, Vocational Teacher Preparation and/or Secondary Education. Additional preference will be given to students from the Greater Western Region of New York state. To remain eligible for the scholarship, students must maintain the academic qualifications for the Presidential Scholarship award.

William S. Barnes '33 New Student Scholarship¹ (ACNT 646)

Amount: \$850 Recipient: One

This award will be presented to an entering student with an outstanding academic record. Criteria includes high school or transfer college average, standardized test scores and leadership skills.

Amount: \$800 Recipient: One

This award was created by Dr. Patti McGill Peterson, Vice President of the Institute of International Education and Executive Director of the Council for International Exchange of Scholars. A distinguished educator, Dr. Peterson was formerly the Vice President for Academic Services at Oswego State, Senior Fellow at the Institute for Public Affairs at Cornell University, and President Emerita of Wells College and St. Lawrence University. The scholarship, intended to encourage the pursuit of excellence at Oswego State, will go to a freshman in the Honors Program who wishes to continue in the program in his/her sophomore year. To qualify for this scholarship a student must:

- Be a freshman enrolled in the Honors Program during Spring semester
- Intend to continue in the Honors Program
- Recipient will be selected by Honors faculty

William S. Barnes '33 Honors Program Scholarship¹ (ACNT 645)

Amount: \$1,100 Recipient: One

Contact: Honors Program Director Deadline: April 10, 2009
In 1980 Mr. Barnes became the first graduate to entrust his estate to Oswego. This scholarship honors this distinguished alumnus for his teaching and leadership skills in the field of Industrial Arts (now Technology). This award recognizes sophomore or junior students currently enrolled in the Honors Program who have superior academic ability, leadership qualities, and commitment for pursuing continued education. Barry W. Atkinson Award¹ (ACNT 641)

Amount: \$1,200 **Recipient:** One
Contact: Office of University Development (315) 312-3003, or Extended Learning (315) 312-2270
Deadline: April 10, 2009

This award is named in honor of Barry W. Atkinson (d.1985), assistant dean of students from 1979–1985 at Oswego. This award is intended to assist those students who can demonstrate that they have overcome or dealt with unusually challenging circumstances in their effort to pursue their education. To qualify for this award, a student must:

- Maintain a 2.5 or better cumulative grade point average
- Have completed at least one year of degree study at Oswego State
- Be currently enrolled for a minimum of 6 semester hours of course work, and maintain at least that level of enrollment during the award year
- Submit documentation (essay) which explains the challenge(s) he/she has dealt with in pursuit of his/her higher education
- Submit two reference statements to support application
- Complete and return application and required documentation to the Office of University Development, Sheldon Hall.

NOTE: Previous winners are not eligible to re-apply.

This award was created by Beva Pease Muirhead '46 (d.2006), widow of the late Benjamin Muirhead '42 (d.1998), to commemorate their lifelong commitment to learning and academic excellence. This scholarship is intended to provide funding for a Presidential Scholar returning to Oswego State for his/her sophomore, junior, or senior year. Students from Western New York will be given first preference. To qualify for this award a student must:

- Be a Presidential Scholar currently in his/her freshman, sophomore or junior year during the spring semester, who intends to continue undergraduate study at Oswego the following academic year.
- Meet the academic qualifications for the Presidential Scholarship award.
- Complete and return application materials to the Office of University Development, Sheldon Hall.

Charles Edward Wisotsky Educational Memorial Fund¹ (ACNT 602)

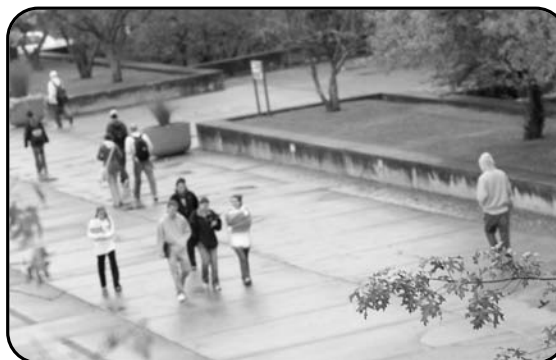
