2. SUNY Oswego Fiscal Year 2017-2018 (slide)

- Nick: Institutional research reports to President's office
- TAP credit up \$300k/year
- Tuition Reimbursement accounts
- Raises distributed to accounts
- Anticipate percentages to remain same. \$71.6m for '17-'18
- Fort Drum-we aren't there as we were in the past

Fiscal Year Raise Impact (slide)

- IFR Reserves are starting to decline—deploy resources to mitigate the raises
- The rational tuition is helpful.

3. NYS Budget 2019-2020

Summary (slide)

- We have the fourth largest cohort of Excelsior students in SUNY (over 900)
- We have the largest cohort of all comprehensive colleges

Concerns (slide)

- Mid-year pull back hasn't happened in more than 10 years
- Used to be post-audit, may change to pre-audit—delays construction
- Trying to accelerate construction in case it passes

4. SUNY Oswego Budget 2019-2020 (slide)

- IFR reserves and reviewing other possible solutions to decrease the deficit
- We need to find a way to reduce deficit so it is manageable for the future
- Discussing efficiencies. How can we do things more efficiently
- Reviewing how to save 10-15% on utilities

5. NYS Capital Budget 2019-2020 (slide)

Working with SUCF to accelerate our capital plan

6. SUNY Oswego Capital Projects (slide)

- Question: Thinking about all of the different ways to save energy (reduce heating, a/c, and lighting)? Yes
- Comment: In the library-reduced energy usage by replacing fluorescent with LED lights
- Question: Campus looking at solar panels? Yes
 - Comment: Chancellor mentioned the Green Revolving Fund (\$1m)

7. Extra Service Study (slide)

- First meeting a few weeks ago: discussed terms and definitions and data there are opportunities for efficiencies. Thinking about policies and procedures around it
- Extra Service activities are related to expenditure areas: adjuncts, compensation for administrative work, course caps, and assigned time
- Membership? Faculty, staff, administration

8. Questions and Discussion

- PRODi-G: Deadline was extended to July. Possibilities to roll 2019-2020 hires into proposal (ten-year plan)
- Residence Hall programs: looking for efficiencies/energy savings in the residence halls
- This group is important to help find those efficiencies and communicate the efficiencies to the campus
- Want to strategize
- Question: Incentivize people to not park on campus? For energy reduction, and have people who want to pay for closer parking? Unable to charge faculty for parking
- Question: Possible to close the campus for one week in January? To save money? December 24-Janary 5? Consider CSEA and UUP employee impact. Will review how it is done elsewhere. Have done it in the past—give alternate work locations.
