## MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

### Core Requirements (24 credit hours)

CRJ 101 Introduction to Criminal Justice

#### CHOOSE ONE 200 level course:

CRJ 210 Introduction to Policing **OR**  
CRJ 220 Intro to Courts & Judicial Process **OR**  
CRJ 230 Introduction to Corrections

CRJ 333 Crime Theories & Victimization  
CRJ 387 Research Methods in Criminal Justice  
CRJ 401 Seminar in Criminal Justice

### Electives (21 credit hours)

To be selected under advisement from a departmentally approved list of courses from cooperating departments (Anthropology, Chemistry, Criminal Justice, Counseling & Psychological Services, Human Development, Political Science, Psychology, and Sociology). Courses are to be selected to suit the student's interests and career orientation in specific areas of Criminal Justice. One course must be an approved upper division writing course.

### Declaration of Major

Students who wish to declare a major in Criminal Justice must apply online through their MyOswego account. The minimum requirement is a GPA of 2.0 or greater at the time of application. Check with the CRJ Department office for details.

**Public Justice Majors** [You were a major BEFORE Fall 2018]. All PBJ majors as of Spring 2019 no longer need to take PBJ 301 and PBJ 397. As a Public Justice major you will replace these two courses with Upper-Division Writing Courses accepted in the PBJ major. IF you have taken either PBJ 301 and/or PBJ 397 those still count and you don't need to replace them.

If you wish to switch to the CRJ major, please speak with your faculty advisor to ensure the change is right for you.

## MINOR REQUIREMENTS

### Core Requirements (9 credit hours)

CRJ 101 Introduction to Criminal Justice  
CRJ 220 American Criminal Courts/Judicial Process  
CRJ 333 Crime Theories & Victimization

### Electives (12 credit hours)

To be selected under advisement from a departmentally approved list of courses from cooperating departments (Anthropology, Chemistry, Criminal Justice, Counseling & Psychological Services, Human Development, Political Science, Psychology, and Sociology). Courses are to be selected to suit the student's interests and career orientation in specific areas of Criminal Justice. At least 15 credit hours of major electives must be taken at the 300 level or above.

### Declaration of Minor

Students who wish to declare a minor in Criminal Justice must apply online through their MyOswego account. The minimum requirement is a GPA of 2.0 or greater at the time of application. Check with the CRJ Department office for details.
