- Marcia - Educause - Bring your own - what comes to mind?
- I was asked to do a workshop on hybrids and the only one that came was John Kane. We had a discussion on MOOCs.
  - MOOCs - Massive Open Online Courses

  - MOOCs are really big, however, most of the people that attend them, don't complete them.
  - Use the technology out there to reinvent that model that is out there.
  - Strategic planning – what's our identity?
  - Sean - With the size of the MOOC you have a lot of people that sign-up and there are a lot that do finish them.
  - Scott R. - Open online courses, do they include free online courses?
  - Some are and some you have to buy the text book.
  - John K. - At California State they have adopted MOOC as an addition to courses, they found that when they use the combination of the two they have a 95% success rate; 50-55% with regular courses alone.

#### Campus Technology Services Report - Mike

- Mike – Tech news is out.
- Learning management conversions, Angel to Blackboard, summer 2015 - partnering with Canton and SUNY Binghamton.
- Elluminate product to be replaced by Blackboard Collaborate, will try to have a demonstration at the next meeting.
- Busy with the Sciences - occupying a lot of staff time.
- Still no electricity in the networking closets, tentative date of April 22<sup>nd</sup> to get the building on the network.
- Consistent with calls to the Help Desk.
- Security awareness training, we went through and put a list together of faculty, and we sent an email to 177 people. Sample of email shown, these are the type of things that are sent - phishing email.
  - 177 people looked at that, if you clicked on the link it brought you to a page that looks like MyOswego login.
  - If you put in your user id and password, they were able to collect that info.
  - 33 people entered their credentials.
  - Mike followed up with the individuals via email.
  - Marcia - the 33 people that clicked on it, when you sent them an email did you get responses?
  - Mike – Five or six of them responded.
- Discussion regarding security
- Mike - The other thing that GreyCastle did point out was that our results are better than the industry average.

- Marcia - Our lives include bring your own machines, it is not necessarily typical education of how things are different, how do we get that education out there, how do we make that a focus, who's responsibility is it.
- Mike - This is more of a social issue and a usage thing.
- Sean - The risk lies in several areas. The information that people have on their mobile device, if you lose your cell phone, etc. It is really awareness and education.

  - making ourselves more efficient,
  - collaborating with the end user,
  - outcomes in terms of the projects we work on and come back and report on them,
  - the other important part is to have two-way communication,
  - look at pilot projects and look inside departments to get more value of what we are doing, and expand our initiative
- Natalie – Bring Your Own Devices... what have you done in the past?

- Sean - We (University of Windsor) are kind of lucky, we were the first University to have a completely wireless campus; our infrastructure now is kind of easy so we are lucky on the back end to invest in that. We have gone and set aside money in terms of a three-year plan to upgrade the wireless infrastructure, focusing on student areas first, largely because of student evaluations on-line, textbook programs so the students need to have that accessibility, something that we will be looking at here in the near future.
- Scott R. - There is Rice Creek - Any comments on how that will be wired.
- Ty – We are in the process of putting Time Warner out there, they will be on the campus network with wireless access.
