Interested in pursuing NYS Early Childhood Education Certification, Birth – Grade 2? Want to be able to teach Kindergarten or Pre-Kindergarten?



Did You Know?

After earning NYS teacher certification in childhood education grades 1-6, teachers may apply through the NYS Education Department TEACH website to add the early childhood Birth - Grade 2 certification. This certification is not granted through SUNY Oswego, but we offer elective courses to help you toward this goal.



To add the B-2 early childhood education certification, NYSED currently requires:

- 1. Completion of childhood education 1-6 certification
- 2. Course requirements must include 6 credits in each of the following areas: scientific processes; mathematical processes; concepts in historical and social sciences; early childhood education\* coursework.
- 3. \*Two approved classes (6 credits) specifically in early childhood, birth grade 2\*
- 4. Pass the Multi-Subject: Teachers of Early Childhood Birth Grade 2 Content Specialty Test www.nystce.nesinc.com
- 5. Apply for the early childhood education certification through your TEACH account (fee required). Clarifying information can be found on the NYS Education Department website, nysed.gov

\*SUNY Oswego offers two early childhood classes to prepare you toward applying for the NYS B-2 Early Childhood certification.

The two Early Childhood Education electives offered are:
LIT 582 and ECH 383/583



ECH 383/583 Language Arts, Culture and Media for Young Children
This course will build candidates' knowledge of children's literature, media, dramatic and visual arts, and music and movement education for young children, Birth-Grade 2.

\*Prerequisite: FDU 301

LIT 582 Teaching Literacy-Early Childhood This course will develop candidates' knowledge of early and emergent literacy development and effective instructional practices to be utilized with young children, Pre-K-Grade 2. This is a graduate level course. Undergraduate students must have senior standing, dual enrollment approval, instructor approval, and meet GPA requirements to be registered.
