1. Log in to "myOswego"
2. Click on the "Student Records" tab
3. Click on "Apply for Graduation" and complete the required information
4. Follow the on-screen instructions
5. Meet with your major/minor advisor(s) to review and sign your checklist form you printed.

Graduating May 2019

- File online before October 1, 2018
- Return Senior Checklist: December 1, 2018

Graduating August 2019

- File online before February 2, 2019
- Return Senior Checklist: April 1, 2019

*Be sure to declare all majors and minors prior to applying for graduating.

*All students must sign their senior checklist to be eligible to graduate

*August graduates participate in the May graduation ceremony; no special permission needed
