



### Employer Survey

The SUNY Oswego School of Education Employer Survey is a 25-item instrument used to measure employer satisfaction with completer’s preparation. The survey was re-developed in 2019 with the question set being similar to the Alumni and Exit Surveys graduates complete to study the satisfaction from the perspective of multiple stakeholders. In Fall 2019, the invitation to participate in the survey was sent to our eight administrators from partner school districts; six completed the survey for a 75% response rate. Our next iteration fell during Spring 2020, which included a wider group of local administrators (24 invitations were sent); unfortunately, we believe that due to the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, only one administrator completed the survey for a 4% response rate. Spring 2021, we aimed to widen the pool to include employers whom our alumni and program coordinators identified as the current employer of recent completers (within three years). The spring 2021 survey was sent to 92 administrators; 19 completed the survey for a 21% response rate. The School of Education will continue to collect this survey data annually. Due to the small n, data has not been disaggregated by employers of completers from initial and advanced programs.
