

## **Exit Survey**

The SUNY Oswego School of Education **Exit Survey** is a 25-item instrument used to measure completer's satisfaction with their preparation. The survey was re-developed in 2019 with the question set related to the Alumni Survey and Employer Survey in an effort to study the effectiveness from the perspective of multiple stakeholders.

At the conclusion of the candidate's program, an invitation to provide feedback in the form of the exit survey is sent. These data presented are from Spring 2019, Fall 2019, and Spring 2020 across all education programs. During this timeframe, 518 requests to participate in the survey were sent, 381 candidates completed the survey resulting in a 74% response rate.
