



Graduation Rates – Undergraduate

The freshman and transfer six-year graduation rate for SUNY Oswego School of Education is presented in Table A. Disaggregated data by the program is available in Table B. The number of candidates includes all candidates entered during the fall semester in 2012, 2013, and 2014. **The graduation rate is provided by candidates who entered and graduated in their first major, in other teaching majors, and in non-teaching majors.** Overall, the School of Education exceeds the university benchmark of 67% for students entering Fall 2013.
