

Educational Opportunity Program (EOP)
Peer Leader Position Application Process
Spring 2016

1. Any student seeking an EOP Peer Leader position must apply to enroll in EDU204: Peer Leader Training for the 2016 Spring semester. If selected for **taking the EDU 204 course, it does not necessarily guarantee a peer leader position.**
2. Spring 2016 Registration - The EDU204 course is scheduled to meet on Mondays and Wednesdays from 3-4:30pm. You must keep this time slot available on your schedule for class time. If selected to take the course you will be registered for it by the EDU204 instructor. **For registration purposes, you should register for five courses consistent with your typical course load with the understanding that you will likely drop your 5th course if selected for EDU204.*
3. To be accepted into the EDU204 course, students must complete and submit an application packet containing a resume, cover letter, and two letters of recommendation to our office. (See attached for detailed information of what needs to be contained in each document). Applications will be accepted in our main office (CC171) no later than **October 30, 2015.**
4. Please submit your available times for Tuesdays and Thursdays for an interview. Should you be selected for an interview with EOP staff, they will occur between **November 9th and November 20th.**
5. EDU204 decision letters will be mailed out on **Wednesday, December 2, 2015.**

EDU204 Application Packets materials:

The application packet for EDU204 consists of a resume (as specified below), a cover letter, and two letters of recommendation.

1. Resume - Your resume should include your employment history and leadership roles on campus and in the community. Additionally, you should identify courses taken in your major. If you are an undeclared student, you should identify your coursework in general.
2. Cover Letter - Your cover letter should address your interest in an EOP Peer Leader position and include what you identify as your academic strengths and why, what you identify as your leadership strengths and why, your knowledge of and any experience with the EOP program and your engagement in the college overall. Lastly, you should address what you hope to learn as a result of the experience.
3. Recommendations - Two letters of recommendation are necessary to complete your application. Recommenders may not include members of the EOP staff (APC's or the Director). One letter must be from a faculty or professional staff member (Hall Director, faculty mentor, Compass staff, etc.). The second letter may be from a person of your choosing.

Please submit resume, cover letter, Tuesday/Thursday availability and two letters of recommendation as a complete packet via email to deborah.kite@oswego.edu by October 30, 2015.

Typically, the EOP Peer Leader position has a work commitment of 5 weeks during the summer (typically the last week of June and the full month of July), has a stipend of \$2,500, and includes on-campus housing and meals.

Course Description
EDU204: Peer Leader Training

Course Description: EDU 204 is designed to provide students with foundational knowledge in collaboration, leadership, and practice specific to Peer Leadership for the Educational Opportunity Program (EOP). Consistent with the authentic learning strategies of the School of Education, students will enhance their knowledge and understanding of the culture of the academy, scholarly work, leadership, mentoring, conflict resolution, social justice, organization, and planning.

About the Educational Opportunity Program (EOP)

The purpose of the Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) is to fulfill New York State's commitment to provide access to higher education for economically disadvantaged students who possess the potential to succeed in college, but whose academic preparation in high school has not fully prepared them to pursue college education successfully. The primary mission of EOP is to facilitate the recruitment, enrollment, retention, and graduation of these students. This is accomplished by providing EOP students with an array of educationally related support services and opportunities including our mandatory 4 week EOP Summer Program for incoming EOP Freshmen.

**Peer Leader Job Description
EOP Summer Program 2016**

This position is a five-week, live-in position reporting to the EOP Director. All Peer Leaders will live on-campus with the EOP Freshman during the summer program. **Taking a second, third or fourth session summer course is not permitted.**
