

**SUNY Oswego Educational Opportunity Program (EOP)

Summer Program 2018**

Program Mission:

The purpose of the EOP Summer Program is to introduce and prepare our first year EOP students for the successful transition to college-level learning and living.

General Expectations:

To be a successful, independent, and active learner, students must consistently participate in a variety of learning situations both in and out of class. General class participation in the form of daily and punctual attendance, timely and satisfactory completion of assigned work, contributions to group efforts, engagement in class discussions, and consistent self-management of course requirements is expected.

Attendance:

- Punctuality is an important part of being an independent learner. You are expected to be on time, prepared for, and participate in all classes.
- Peer leaders and instructors must be informed **IMMEDIATELY** of any illness preventing you from attending a class. This will be the only acceptable excuse for an absence.
- All absences will be reported to the EOP director.

Classroom Etiquette:

- Respectful behavior is expected at all times.
- All electronic devices place in silent mode - on vibrate – and stowed away.
- Food and drinks are not permitted in the classroom or computer labs.

Evaluation:

The successful completion of the EOP Summer Program will be determined by the following:

1. An overall final average of **80%** or higher. Each of your summer activities will count as follows.

Achieving Personal Excellence Class	15%
Financial Aid and Campus Resources Workshops	10%
Study Hall, tutoring, and instructors' office hours	10%
APC individual and group meetings	10%
Community Service and Oswego History	5%
Fun Friday and Peer Leader Activities	5%

Overall Final Average: 100%
