The SUNY Oswego Eta Gamma Chapter of Alpha Sigma Lambda, national honor society for adult learners in college, offers an annual scholarship to one of its members. Applicants will be chosen based on GPA, awards and scholarships already received, and community and/or college service. Applicants must:

- a. Be a member of Eta Gamma Chapter of Alpha Sigma Lambda
- b. Be matriculated in an undergraduate degree program at SUNY Oswego
- c. Have completed 30 hours toward degree requirements
- d. Submit application, personal statement and letter of reference from faculty or staff member which address academic achievement, potential for success, personal qualities and evidence of leadership

Gillespie/Pietroski Scholarship^{1,2,3} (ACNT 6380)

Amount: \$1,300 / Recipient: One / Deadline: February 8, 2016

This award was established by M. Jean Pietroski '71, '74 to honor the lives and accomplishments of her parents, Milton Hope and Marjorie Lucy (Roth) Gillespie. The scholarship is intended to recognize an individual who demonstrates courage, determination and enthusiasm for learning.

To qualify for this award a student must:

- a. Be a non-traditional student, preferably from the Phoenix Central School system or Oswego County, returning to school after at least a ten-year interruption in formal education.
- b. Be a full-time junior (completed 57–86 credits, including transfer credits, by the end of this year's winter session) enrolled in the School of Education pursuing a degree leading to teacher certification at SUNY Oswego.
- c. Be a person of sound character who exhibits commitment to his/her higher education.
- d. Maintain a minimum 3.00 SUNY Oswego cumulative GPA
- e. Demonstrate financial need

Jack C. James '62 Scholarship^{1,3} (ACNT 6399)

This scholarship was established by Jack C. James '62 in appreciation and recognition of the role Oswego plays in enabling non-traditional students to complete their education, gain postgraduate credentials or undergo career change. This award is intended to inspire students for academic achievement and subsequent leadership in the larger society, whether this is within the realm of academia, government, business or the military. To qualify for this award, a student must:

- a. Be a non-traditional undergraduate or graduate student enrolled or enrolling in SUNY Oswego's School of Education full or part-time. Secondary preference may be given to students enrolling or enrolled in SUNY Oswego's School of Business
- b. Maintain a minimum 3.00 SUNY Oswego GPA
- c. Provide two letters from faculty, community leaders or employers that speak to the criteria for this award
- d. Complete the application and essay in this publication demonstrating a financial need where this scholarship might be the difference in continuing with his or her education

Lt. Col. Mike Waters, USAF (Ret.) '70 Scholarship^{1,3} (ACNT 6457)

- a. Be enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student in good academic standing as a freshman, sophomore or junior (completed 0–86 credits, including transfer credits, by deadline)
- b. Demonstrate financial need
- c. Preference will be given to veterans (particularly combat veterans)
- d. Preference will be given to military students

R. Lee Martin Award^{2,3} (ACNT 6659)

Amount: \$800 each / Recipient(s): One Traditional Student & One Non-Traditional Student / Deadline: February 8, 2016
