



THE HDV MULTIDISCIPLINARY LEARNING AGREEMENT

Human Development (HDV) majors and minors create a Multidisciplinary Learning Agreement based on individualized learning goals in consultation with academic advisors.

WHO? All HDV majors & minors will fulfill the Elective section in Degree Works.

WHAT? Choose **3** classes (3-400 level) for **3** credits each from **3** different prefixes.

- **May I use an HDV course?** Yes, if it is not already used for HDV.
- **May I use a class from my minor or 2nd major?** Yes, if it is relevant.
- **Do I need advisor permission to take a class?** You can ask an opinion, but if you can justify the course, it probably works. Many students choose from more than 3.
- **Special MLA Tracks include Health* and Oswego Children's Project* (see your advisor).**

WHEN? Your Academic Advisor completes the MLA with your senior checklist.

WHERE? Use any class on campus that you justify as relevant to your career goals.

WHY? It encourages personal and career exploration & reflects the multidisciplinary nature of the program.
