International Student Fact Sheet 2014-2015

At a Glance:

- SUNY Oswego currently hosts **261** international & exchange students from **24** different countries.
- 136 undergraduates; 9 graduate; 116 non-degree (exchange & international from Brazil).
- International students comprise 3.2% of the total student body and 1.8% of the first year class.
- Top five countries of origin: **South Korea** (31.4%), **Brazil** (24.9%), **China** (13.4%), **Canada** (11.5%), and **Sri Lanka** (3.4%).
- Top majors of study: Business, Management, Marketing and Related Support Services (28.0%); Communication, Journalism and Related Programs (5.0%).
- Among degree-seeking students **15.9%** are studying in a STEM field.
