Step 1..... Apply online

www.oswego.edu/international/undergraduate-applications
Select the "SUNY APPLICATION" or "COMMON APPLICATION" option.

Step 2..... Pay \$50 USD application fee

for undergraduate students.

Step 3..... Submit required documents

Please submit the following documents:

3A. Official College Transcript or High School Transcript

Submit originals or official copies of degrees, diplomas, or certificates. Documents must include an official transcript with record of courses and grades/marks received. Please mail your documents to:

Please note that an application is not complete until all official documents have been received. Scanned copies of transcripts are not accepted.

Undergraduate (Bachelor): Applicants must have the equivalent of a U.S. high school diploma with a minimum grade point average (GPA) equivalent to 2.5 on a U.S. 4.0 grading scale.

3B. English Proficiency Score

To enter an academic program directly, students must provide evidence of English proficiency by one of the following options (conditional admission is available):

Scholarships and Awards

All international students are eligible for Destination Oswego Scholarship **\$6,000 - \$9,000 yearly**, renewable for **4 years = \$24,000 - \$36,000**

Students who submit SAT scores of 1100 minimum and have at least a B+ GPA average, will be considered for a Merit Scholarship in addition to Destination Oswego Scholarship.

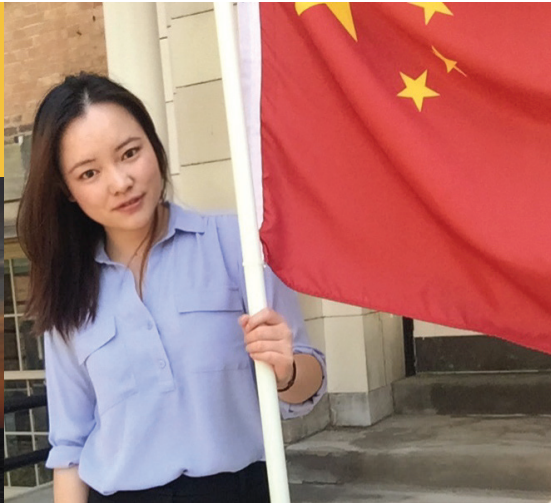

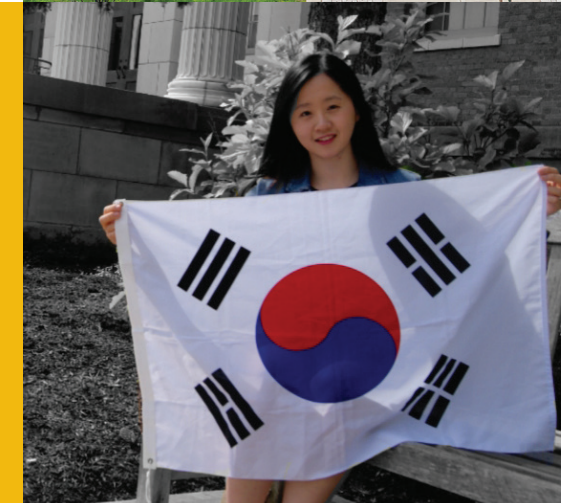
