

OPT TIMELINE



Optional Practical Training (OPT)

LOCATION:

- You do not need to have a job lined up to apply for OPT!
- Students may engage in OPT for any employer during their authorization period, <u>as long as that employment is</u> <u>directly related to their major</u>

Optional Practical Training (OPT)

DURATION:

- Maximum of <u>12 months</u> per education level (BA, MA...)
- You cannot accrue more than <u>90 days of unemployment!</u>

POST-GRADUATION

Optional Practical Training (OPT)

OTHER POINTS:

- OPT can be paid or unpaid (some volunteering counts!)
- Travelling outside the USA is not advised while OPT is pending
- You may be self-employed
- You may work for multiple employers

What is an EAD Card?

ANSWER:

EAD = Employment

Authorization Document

This is the card that you receive when your OPT has been approved.

What is an EAD Card?

ANSWER:



When can I submit my application?

ANSWER:

OPT applications may be submitted 90 days *before* your graduation date, until 60 days *after* your graduation date.

If you're graduating in **Fall 2022**, the earliest you can apply is September 12. Apply early!!!

How long does it take to receive my EAD Card?

ANSWER:

Between **3 - 5 months**.

When can I start working?

ANSWER:

Once your OPT program start date occurs, **as long as your EAD Card has arrived**.

What kind of employment am I eligible for?

ANSWER:

Your employment must:

- Be directly related to your major field of study;
- 2. Can be paid or unpaid;
- 3. Should be at least 20 hours/week;
- 4. Some volunteering counts!

What if I don't find a job?

ANSWER:

You have an aggregate total of **90 days** to find a job after your program start date has passed.

What if I don't find a job?

ANSWER:

If you do not find a job during those 90 days, then you will need to:

- 1. **Leave** the United States;
- 2. **Change/transfer** your educational level;
- 3. Or change to another **visa** status (uncommon).


How do I report my employment?

ANSWER:

SEVP Portal:

sevp.ice.gov/opt

It is **VERY** important that you keep this portal up to date!



Can I travel while on OPT?

ANSWER:

Travel while your OPT is pending is **NOT** advised.

After OPT is approved, you will need:

- 1. Your **EAD Card**;
- 2. **Proof** that you have a job;
- 3. Your **signed** Form I-20;
- 4. **Unexpired** F-1 visa.

Can I travel while on OPT?

ANSWER:

Can I extend my OPT period?

ANSWER:

Yes, for 24 months if you are a STEM (Science, Tech, Engineering, Math) major:
