





Things you should know before arrival

- Orientation is required for all new students (AUG 23 25)
- Flights arrangements should arrive into Syracuse Hancock International Airport no later than 8:00 PM on AUGUST 22
- Carry at least \$200 USD in small bills for initial needs or emergency
- Check the **weather** at Oswego online

Packing?

When considering what to pack, keep in mind that SUNY Oswego students generally adopt a casual style of dressing. Useful items to bring with you would include:

Summer clothing, Winter clothing (ex. Long boots for snowy weather & warm parkas), and one or two nicer outfits with dress shoes for formal occasions

Traditional/national costume to have available for cultural events

Immunization

- Complete health history and immunication forms: https://oswego.medicatconnect.com/
- Required with a doctor's or other health professional's signature. Students are required to show proof of 2 MMR vaccines that were given after their 1st birthday or 1 MMR and 1 measles vaccine given after 1st birthday.

Please be sure that all information is usual line in the signed or stamped by a Medical Doctor and sent in PDF format if possible.

You must register into a minimum of 12 credit hours to maintain your status as a full time student at Oswego.

Saturday, August 25: Orientation (graduate students only)



The Centro Bus

The local bus system takes you around campus, the Oswego county and to Syracuse (Destiny USA). The bus fares for Oswego are included in your mandatory tuition (except for Syracuse where you have to pay \$2-5).

You can ride with a sticker provided by the school.

Uber & Taxis

There are also many Ubers and taxis available which will take you around Oswego, Syracuse and the airport.

Where can you buy books?

Visit campus bookstore, which is located in the Hewitt Union.

→ It has both used and new books (Basically, used books are cheaper than new books). You may order books online ahead of time and pick them up when you come to campus. College store will set up all books based on your order.

Another place you can buy books near campus is **Kraftees**.

→ It is about 10 minutes far from Sheldon Hall where the Office of International Education is. Sometimes they might not have the book that you need but sometimes they offer a cheaper price than the campus store.

There are two online sites: <u>Amazon and Checc.</u>

→ Both sites provide rental services, which means you can rent books for one semester and return those back after the semester finishes. Amazon sometimes offers a cheaper price than other online stores.

Where can you buy things you need?

- → Bed Sheets, stationery, accessories, cheap clothes, detergent, shampoo, food, etc....
- → Walmart is the easiest store to go by bus and has almost all the essentials you need




