### News & Happenings

- Penfield Librarians and staff had a **Welcome Table** set up on 8/23 and 8/24 to hand out maps, provide directions, and help ease first week jitters. We recorded more than 200 interactions with students over these two days.
- We also joined in the Mental Health & Wellness Fair on 9/1, partnering with the Oswego Public Library as they kicked off their efforts for library card sign up month and gathered student interest for volunteering at the public library to give performances or share other talents.
- We welcomed roughly 1,100 new students during our **Laker Launch** event on 8/18 with an open house that introduced students to the wealth of services, staff, and resources at Penfield Library.
- We are currently training students for our new <u>Ambassador Program</u>. This is a unique opportunity for Oswego students to develop valuable, resume-building skills while also contributing to our campus (and having fun!).
- Chancellor's Award and Distinguished Faculty Award photographs in the library's stairwells have been updated to reflect current faculty award winners. The previous award winners' photographs have been digitized and placed in <u>OswegoDL</u>.
- A **Library Sustainability Committee** has been created. We will be working with partners across campus to do our part in lessening our carbon footprint, even as we continue to improve services.

- **Library instruction** has begun. Last year Penfield Librarians provided class-specific information literacy instruction for roughly 2000 students in classes across campus, both synchronous and asynchronous.
- The library is spearheading a 1<sup>st</sup> Generation Student Collective, focusing on providing research assistance and workshops to SUNY Oswego's many first-generation college students. Look for events on the SUNY Oswego events calendar and encourage the first gens you know to attend.
- There is now a **Self-Checkout station** in the library. Look for it on the first floor and let us know if you have questions.
- The *Grand Challenges: Fresh Water for All* anthologies of student writing, V.1, Issues 1 & 2, are now in the college archives and in <u>Oswego DL</u>.
- Archives & Special Collections has an intern from the History Department for the fall semester.
- The <u>Library Resource Guides</u> on Penfield's website were reorganized over the summer to make them more accessible. They are now sorted by Subject, Course, How-To, Topic, and Faculty. Check them out and let us know if there are any other guides you would like to see added.
