Who We Are

Health Services promotes the health and wellness of students so that they can be successful in their academic pursuits, personal lives, and be able to make positive personal health choices and decisions.

Medical Insurance

It is mandatory that all SUNY Oswego students have adequate health insurance. Please be sure your insurance policy will cover medical services in this area.

Mandatory Health Fee

Health Services, Counseling Services Center, and Health Education programs are supported by the mandatory health fee on the student's tuition bill. This is not to be confused with medical insurance. Part time and summer session students pay the health fee on a prorated basis.

Confidentiality

Medical records are strictly confidential and not released to anyone unless:

- The student/legal agent provides Health Services with written authorization to release information, and must be separate from a request to release other academic records such as a transcript or placement.
- There is an official court ordered subpoena requesting medical information.
- The student has communicable disease, which is reportable by law.
- · Imminent harm to self or others.
- · Security Clearance (i.e., FBI, CIA, etc.).

Medical Excuses

Health Services has a long-standing policy that excuses for missed classes, exams, or assignments are not written by Health Services personnel. Class attendance is an administrative matter between the student and their instructor.
