- We can help you get started on papers: understanding the prompt, brainstorming, outlining.
- We can help you with personal statements for graduate school and scholarships.

- Click courses tutors have taken with writing assignments as well as the documentation/citation styles they are comfortable using. Scroll through the list to find tutors who have taken the course you want help in. Consider meeting with one of these tutors. You can always meet with any of the tutors whether or not they have taken the course.
- The Writing Center is not an editing service. Come prepared to have a conversation about the writing you want help with.
