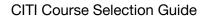


One of the most frequent questions we receive is "What CITI training courses do I need to complete?" The answer to that question depends on your role on campus as a student or faculty and it also depends on some information about the way you are conducting your research:

If you are a **student** conducting human subjects research as part of *a classroom project* (i.e., all aspects of the study are limited to the class, including recruitment of subjects and presentation of results) you should complete the following courses: Students - Class projects ☐ Responsible Conduct of Research for Undergrad Students Please use the CITI Training Classroom Projects Guide to select these courses. If you are a student conducting human subjects research where your subjects and audience will **NOT be limited to only your classmates**, you should complete the following courses: ■ Social and Behavioral Research - Basic/Refresher ☐ Social and Behavioral Responsible Conduct of Research Please use the CITI Training Student Research Guide to select these courses. Students (and their faculty supervisors) should consult the other resources available on the ORSP website to learn more about the differences noted above. This guidance document focuses only on questions pertaining to CITI Training course completion. If you are **faculty** conducting or teaching students about human subjects research, you should complete the following courses: Social and Behavioral Research - Basic/Refresher ☐ Social and Behavioral Responsible Conduct of Research ☐ Revised Common Rule Please use the <u>CITI Training Faculty Research Guide</u> to select these courses. If you are a **student or faculty** conducting **biomedical** human subjects research (e.g. involving blood or other biospecimens), you should complete the following courses: ☐ Biomedical Research - Basic/Refresher ☐ Biomedical Responsible Conduct of Research ☐ Revised Common Rule Please use the CITI Training Biomedical Research Guide to select these courses.

If you have selected the wrong courses for your role, you can always reset your curriculum by selecting "Remove my Affiliation" on the main CITI Training landing page, removing SUNY Oswego, and then choosing "Add an Affiliation" and adding SUNY Oswego again. This will prompt you with





the curriculum selection questions described in these guides. Any courses you have completed will still be listed and counted.
