






## SUNY Oswego Total Headcount Fall 2012-2021



## New Student Enrollment - Spring Semesters Undergraduate, Degree-Seeking First-year and Transfer Students (Full & Part-time)\*










## Fall First-Year Applications and Offers as of ~ Feb. 1<sup>st</sup> Each Year

## SUNY Oswego Current Budget Year Update Fiscal Year 2021-2022

- ► Fully restored state tax support
- All union contract raises were paid by SUNY Oswego
  - ► UUP Discretionary: \$235,798
  - Equity Compression: \$235,798 to 264 employees





## Governor's Proposed Budget Highlights Fiscal Year 2022-2023

- Executive Budget (proposed increase): \$48.8m
- No tuition increase proposed
- Proposed increase to funding for EOP
- ► Full elimination of the TAP Gap in 2022-2023
- Annual Reset of the Excelsion Scholarship Program Tuition

- Capital Funding (same as previous)
  - Critical Maintenance: \$550m
  - ► Allocated to campus: \$153.4m
  - Priority projects: \$396.6m
- New Flexible Capital Funding
  - Proposed \$425m to be used for new construction, programmatic or critical maintenance projects
  - Distributions to campus TBD

### Oswego College Foundation Update\*


- Endowment is currently over \$61.2 million

- ► Hewitt Hall Phase II (pre-bid): \$38m
- ► Hewitt Quad \$5m
- Rudolph Road Steam Line \$5m
- Critical Maintenance
  - ► Emergency Generators \$2.5m
  - ► Roofs \$2.1m
  - ► HVAC \$1.4m







#### **Capital Updates: In Construction**

- ► Hewitt Hall Phase I \$18m
- Sheldon Terracotta \$14m
- ► Hart Hall Upgrades \$1.3m
- Artville/Bookville Relocation \$1.3m

- Mental Health and Wellness HEERF
  - ► Fitness center membership for students
- ► AASCU's Transformation Accelerator Cohort
  - ► Focus on parity in student outcomes for Black, Latinx, Indigenous, and low-income students
